Know Your Rights is a 7-week legal education program for up to 25 asylum seekers, refugees and beneficiaries of different forms of protection who are building new lives in Italy.

### What are the requirements to apply?

1. You are over 18 years old.
2. You speak Italian or English at B1 level - intermediate.
3. You live in or near Milan.
